



Preventative Maintenance Mechanic

PM Mechanic Job Description

The Preventative Maintenance Mechanic inspects, services, and helps maintain our range of heavy-duty road construction equipment (backhoes, track hoes, dozers, etc.) and our fleet of vehicles. The Service Lube Technician is responsible for providing regular preventative maintenance and assisting with repairs to the construction fleet and equipment.

PM Mechanic Responsibilities:

- Responsible for performing full-service preventative maintenance on trucks, heavy equipment, and other tools/equipment as needed.
- Keeps record of service on each vehicle, piece of equipment, or tool.
- Receives supervision from lead mechanic and Shop Foreman.
- Lubricating moving parts as necessary, including those in the engine and wheel bearings and ensuring the engine is kept clean throughout servicing.
- Inspects vehicle frames, crossmembers, and other parts for cracks and damage.
- Checking tire pressure and filling tires with air as needed to manufacturer specifications.
- Checks and adjusts brakes and clutches and replaces all filters.
- Replaces positive crankcase ventilation (PCV) valves and wheel seals.
- Changes and inspects fuel, oil, transmission fluid, and water levels.
- Moves heavy (up to 100 pounds with aid to assist) parts and equipment.
- Cleans work area and equipment using cleaning fluids and agents.
- Works in small, cramped areas and at heights greater than ten feet in repairing certain vehicles.

PM Mechanic Experience/Education Requirements:

- Clean MVR is desired.
- Proven work experience as a service / lube technician with diesel engines or equipment.
- Understanding of computer testing technologies.
- Physical requirements:
 - Manually lift/carry 50-100 lbs.
 - Stand, walk, sit, kneel, crouch, or crawl for long periods of time.
- Ability to perform all required tasks during all weather conditions (hot/cold), and to work extended hours, as needed.
